## A Sunday Gospel Reflection

When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things.

Mark 6:34

Both Jesus and the Twelve Apostles had been working very hard. The Twelve had been out on mission to many of the neighboring towns preaching, healing the sick and casting out demons. Upon the completion of their mission, they returned to Jesus and reported all that

they had done. Jesus, in turn, invited them to "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." But the crowds heard about their departure by boat and quickly went to the other side of the Sea of Galilee so that they would arrive before Jesus and the Twelve. The passage quoted above reveals the internal reaction that Jesus had toward the crowds as He and the Twelve disembarked from the boat. Though they had attempted to go away together to a quiet place for rest, the crowds were intent on being with them. Jesus, of course, was not upset that the crowds had spoiled His attempt to find some quiet time with the Twelve. Instead, His heart was moved with compassion. He could see that the people were hungry for more and were "like sheep without a shepherd." For that reason, Jesus immediately began to feed them with His teachings. A helpful point to ponder in this passage is that the people who gathered were described as a "vast crowd." From the subsequent passage in Mark's Gospel, we learn that when Jesus finished teaching them many things, He performed the miracle of the multiplication of fish and bread and fed 5,000 men, not counting the women and children. Given the fact that the estimated ratio at that time of adult men to women and children was at least 5:1, the crowd could have been as large as 25,000 people. For a spontaneous gathering of people in a remote area by the Sea of Galilee, that is a huge number. This is especially the case, since it is estimated that there were only about 1,500 people living in Capernaum at that time. People had flocked to our Lord from very far away. This vast and spontaneous gathering reveals to us the hunger that Jesus instilled in the hearts of very many people. Some of these people had already heard Jesus speak and had witnessed His miracles. Others were those to whom the Twelve had just preached in the surrounding villages. The Twelve had spoken clearly and convincingly by the power of the Holy Spirit about Jesus, and many people responded, wanting to know more about our Lord. As you ponder the enthusiasm of so many people, try to compare that with your own enthusiasm for Jesus. Are you driven to seek Him out with the same passion and zeal that consumed these first followers? Or do you find that your zeal and enthusiasm are lacking at times? This vast crowd, with their zeal and determination to seek out our Lord, should be a source of inspiration and self-examination for us all. Reflect, today, upon this vast crowd. Try to see yourself joining them. Ponder yourself being so moved by the preaching of the Apostles that you become single-focused in your determination to be fed by Jesus' holy teaching. If it is hard to imagine yourself acting this way, then humbly acknowledge that you may need more zeal for Jesus in your life. Pray that these holy desires become stirred up within you, and do all that you can to foster such zeal. Reflect, today, upon this vast crowd. Try to see yourself joining them. Ponder yourself being so moved by the preaching of the Apostles that you become single-focused in your determination to be fed by Jesus' holy teaching. If it is hard to imagine yourself acting this way, then humbly acknowledge that you may need more zeal for Jesus in your life. Pray that these holy desires become stirred up within you, and do all that you can to foster such zeal.

## PSR and Sacramental Preparation 2024-2025

We are happy to offer several faith formation options for the Lakewood Catholic community. Families with children in public school, or non-Catholic schools are invited to consider one of the following faith formation options. Parish School of Religion programs follow the school year calendar, beginning in late August / early September and meeting through early May.

#### Parish School of Religion: Families will have three options to choose from:

Option 1 – Family PSR - Parish School of Religion: Families with children in grades 1-8 will complete the Pflaum Gospel Weekly lessons at home with their children and have quarterly in-person check-ins. The check-ins will take place at Saint Clement Church. In addition, families enrolled in Family PSR will gather with other PSR families several times throughout the year for fellowship and formation activities. Families who choose this option are asked to attend a parent meeting on Monday, September 9 at Saint Clement Church Hall, 6:30 pm -8:00 pm.

Option 2 – Catechesis of the Good Shepherd: Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori inspired approach to the religious formation of children, rooted in Sacred Scripture, Liturgy and respect for the child's rich relationship with God. The children gather in a specially prepared space called an Atrium. A typical session includes prayer, a presentation on scripture or liturgy, and time for the children to work with the prepared materials and quietly ponder the mysteries presented. The Level I Atrium is prepared for children ages 3 – 6 year old (K). The Level II Atrium is prepared for children ages 6 – 9, 1st grade – 3rd grade. Level 1 and Level 2 meet on Wednesday evenings 6:30 pm – 8:00 pm at the Saint James Parish Center. A Parent Meeting for parents new to CGS will be held Wednesday, August 28 at Saint James Parish Center, 6:30 pm – 8:00 pm. Students new to CGS begin September 4, returning students begin September 25.

Option 3 – Classroom PSR Model for students in grades 1- 8, students meet in classrooms with catechists. Students study the Sophia Institute program *Spirit of Truth*. This option takes place at the Saint Luke school building, Mondays 6:30 pm - 7:30 pm. In addition, families enrolled in the Classroom Model will gather with other PSR families several times throughout the year for fellowship and formation activities. Classroom PSR begins Monday, September 16 at Saint Luke School Building. 6:30 pm - 7:30 pm.

#### Sacramental Preparation: First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion, Confirmation

Preparation for the Sacrament of First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation is in addition to PSR attendance and Catholic school. Students from all three parishes will prepare together for the Sacraments.

Preparation for Reconciliation and First Communion traditionally begins when students are in their 2nd grade year.

Preparation for Confirmation traditionally begins in the 7th grade and continues through the 8th grade year.

A Parent Meeting for parents of children preparing for First Reconciliation will be held on Thursday, September 19 at Saint Luke at 6:30 pm.
