



Jesus became ceremoniously unclean and not permitted to enter the synagogue or temple; but to respond compassionately to the plight of these families becomes more important, more sacred than the "safety" of convention and tradition. May we imitate that same compassion of the healing Christ, risking our own sense of safety and satisfaction in order to bring that love into the lives of others.
