St. Clare of Assisi (1194–1253) was an Italian saint and one of the first followers of St. Francis of Assisi. Inspired by his teachings, she left her wealthy family to embrace a life of poverty and founded the Order of Poor Ladies, later known as the Poor Clares. Clare is known for her deep devotion, humility, and strong leadership. She encouraged a life of radical poverty and prayer, emphasizing simplicity and service. One of her most well-known acts was holding up the Blessed Sacrament to defend her convent from invaders, a moment that reflects her unwavering faith and courage. She is the patron saint of eye diseases, goldsmiths, and laundry workers.

burrito goodbye, dropped the money in the basket, and winced. But strangely, the rest of the Mass I felt more engaged than usual. I had skin in the game. I left the Mass excited to see how God would take care of me. And he did, in amazing ways.

When the poor widow places two copper coins in the temple treasury, Jesus doesn't pity her. He praises her. He blesses her. He brags about her. He celebrates her as the temple's largest benefactor. Her giving is an act of radical, concrete trust in God. It is as if she is entering a new level of giving that excites Jesus, because she contributes not out of her abundance, but she gives "everything she had."

What a challenge this is to each one of us! How easy it is to ignore this! But imagine the eruption of the energy of faith, hope, and love that would be unlocked if our financial sacrifices to the Church actually tapped into daily bread and not only our disposable income. I challenge us to try this in some way this coming week and see what happens in our hearts. Even if it costs us a burrito.

Best Recipes for Thanksgiving The Art of the Salad

I don't know about you, but I think a good salad can be a work of art. Unfortunately, I don't necessarily have the gift of salad making. The salads I make always seem to look like something I pick up off of an old school cafeteria line, but the salads some of my friend's make are just incredible and I'd easily pay a hefty price for some of those delicious greens. After taking a couple notes from their professional salad making skills, I offer this recipe for consideration at your thanksgiving table.

Fall Harvest Salad with Roasted Sweet Potatoes, Apples, and Cranberries

Active Time: 10 mins Total Time: 30 mins

Servings: 4

Ingredients:

- 1 (8 oz.) sweet potato, peeled and diced into 1/2-inch pieces
- · 4 Tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil, divided
- 3/4 tsp. kosher salt, divided
- · 1/2 tsp. garlic powder, divided
- · 2 Tbsp. fresh orange juice (from 1 medium orange)
- · 2 tsp. Dijon mustard
- · 2 tsp. apple cider vinegar
- 1 1/4 tsp. sorghum syrup
- · 5 oz. mixed greens
- · 1 large Honeycrisp apple, cored and thinly sliced
- ¾ cup dried cranberries
- 3 oz. crumbled Feta cheese (about 3/4 cup)
- ½ cup roasted, salted pistachios, chopped

Instructions:

1. Roast the Sweet Potatoes:

Preheat the oven to 425°F and place a baking sheet on the center rack. In a medium bowl, toss the diced sweet potato with 1 tablespoon olive oil, ½ teaspoon salt, and ¼ teaspoon garlic powder. Carefully spread the sweet potato on the preheated baking sheet and bake for 10-15 minutes, stirring halfway through, until tender and golden brown. Set aside to cool slightly.

2. Prepare the Dressing:

In a large bowl, whisk together orange juice, Dijon mustard, apple cider vinegar, sorghum syrup, and the remaining ½ teaspoon each of salt and garlic powder. Slowly drizzle in the remaining 3 tablespoons of olive oil, whisking until the dressing is emulsified.

3. Assemble the Salad:

Add the mixed greens, sliced apple, dried cranberries, crumbled Feta, chopped pistachios, and roasted sweet potatoes to the bowl with the dressing. Toss gently to coat everything in the dressing.

4. Serve:

Arrange the salad on a large platter or in a serving bowl, and drizzle with any remaining dressing from the bowl. Serve immediately and enjoy the fresh, tangy flavors.
